City of Yellowknife Community Grants

The City of Yellowknife provides <u>funding</u> to not-for-profit organizations for the purpose of assisting in the organization of events, projects and programming. Deadline for applications is Friday January 10, 2020

Family literacy funding

We have money to help NWT communities put on family literacy programs and events. Our <u>family literacy funding</u> is available on a first come, first served basis.

United Way Community Investment Fund

Organizations can apply for 1 or 3 year funding for projects. Projects must focus on one of three areas: From poverty to possibility; Healthy people, strong communities; and All that kids can be. <u>Applications</u> are due December 6, 2019.
